Coyote Softball Caps Off 2010 Campaign With Strong Finish

The University of South Dakota softball team ended the 2010 season on a strong note with a second-place finish at the Great West Championship at Farmers Branch, Texas on May 17. That finish was part of a good stretch of play late in the season for the Coyotes, who finished 9-3 over their final 12 games and 16-11-1 over their final 28 games. Part of that stretch included a season-high six-game winning streak.

USD, under the direction of third-year Coach Amy Klyse, played a difficult nonconference schedule which included doubleheaders against two 2010 NCAA tournament qualifiers -- North Dakota State and Nebraska. A highlight of the season for the Coyotes was a 1-0 win at NDSU on April 27, the first time USD had beaten a team that had qualified for the NCAA tournament the year before. In that game, USD's Mel Johnson fired the shutout and hit the game-winning home run.

USD also played competitive at Nebraska, leading much of the first game of the doubleheader before losing, 7-5.

The Coyotes also posted impressive wins over nonconference foes Seattle, Sacred Heart, Youngstown State and Detroit Mercy during the season. USD finished a perfect 6-0 at home, including an impressive sweep of North Dakota to close out the regular season. The Coyotes outscored their opponents 48-11 at home this season.

In Great West Conference play, USD was 3-3, losing a pair of extra-inning games. The Coyotes entered Great West Championship as the No. 2 seed and opened with a 7-5 win over Houston Baptist. USD also avenged two losses to Utah Valley with a 3-1 win over the Wolverines in an elimination game to advance to the championship, where the Coyotes suffered a heartbreaking 1-0 loss to North Dakota in the championship. USD finished the tournament 2-2 and took second. Dani Bahlmann, Rachel Fricke, Johnson, and Callie Roan each earned all-tournament honors.

Johnson was named the Great West Pitcher of the Year and earned first-team All-GWC honors, while four Coyotes -- Melissa Blackburn, Michelle Jones, Callie Roan and Alexa Rudeen -- were named to the All-GWC second team. Johnson was a two-time Great West Conference Pitcher of the Week while Erica Denney, Jones and Roan also earned weekly honors from the league.

Several Coyotes ranked nationally in statistics in 2010, according to the NCAA stats web site:

- Callie Roan finished third in the nation in sacrifice hits per game at 0.4.
- Alexa Rudeen finished tied for 35th in doubles per game at 0.31.
- Lexie Eversley ranked tied for 35th in being hit by a pitch per game (0.25).
- Mel Johnson finished tied for 113th with 16 wins.
- Roan finished tied for 135th in walks per game (0.52).

Head Coach Amy Klyse

Amy Klyse recently completed her third season as the head softball coach at The University of South Dakota. Klyse, a native of Sacramento, Calif., is guiding the Coyote program to one of its most successful stretches in school history.

Klyse has 73 wins in her first three seasons at USD, which is the second most of any coach in school history. Overall, Klyse has an overall mark 73-73-1 in three seasons at USD, including a 54-48-1 mark during USD's first two years of transitioning to Division I status.

In 2010, USD eclipsed 20 wins for a second straight season, accomplishing that feat for the first time since 2004-05.

Junior Mel Johnson was named the 2010 Great West Conference Pitcher of the Year under Klyse's guidance. In addition, four other Coyotes earned All-Great West Conference second team honors -- Melissa Blackburn, Michelle Jones, Callie Roan and Alexa Rudeen.

On April 27, 2010, USD recorded a historic win, edging North Dakota State 1-0 in Fargo, N.D. It was the Coyotes' first-ever win over a Division I opponent which had competed in the NCAA tournament the year before. NDSU was a final 16 qualifier in 2009, and later in 2010, went on to win the Summit League and advance to the NCAA tournament.

USD finished second in the Great West Conference in 2010, capping off a late momentum surge which saw the Coyotes go 16-11-1 over their final 28 games. USD advanced to the final of the Great West Championship before suffering a heartbreaking 1-0 loss to North Dakota in the finals. Four Coyotes earned all-tournament honors -- Johnson, Roan, Dani Bahlmann and Rachel Fricke.

USD had five players earn weekly Great West Player/Pitcher of the Week honors.

In 2009, she guided USD to a 33-18 mark (.647

winning percentage), which was the second-best season by winning percentage in program history. Included in the season was a 19-14 mark against Division I foes and an 11-game winning streak.

USD also finished second at the Independent Tournament, which included a pair of comeback 8-inning wins over Seattle and Northern Colorado. USD also earned nine Great West Conference Player/Pitcher of the Week honors as well.

Also in 2009, USD's Tagney Jones was named the All-Independent Player of the Year, while Cortney Heim and Mel Johnson earned All-Independent second team honors.

Klyse guided USD to a 19-25 mark in 2008, including a 6-6 record and third-place finish in the North Central Conference. That marked an improvement of four positions from 2007. For her efforts, Klyse was named the NCC's Co-Coach of the Year.

The 19 wins are tied for the third most all-time by a first-year Coyote head coach.

In 2008, USD finished 2-2 at the NCC tournament and took fourth. During the regular season, USD recorded sweeps of Augustana and Nebraska-Omaha.

After graduation from Augustana in 2003, she remained at Augustana and served as the pitching coach. Klyse also served as an assistant softball varsity coach at Sioux Falls Lincoln High School and pitching coach at the University of Sioux Falls.

Klyse enjoyed a decorated career as a pitcher at Augustana College from 2000-03. In four seasons, she finished 89-31 with a 1.21 ERA and had 682 strikeouts in 775 innings pitched.

In 2002, she was 28-11 with a 1.03 ERA. She set single-season records with 258 strikeouts and 272.1 innings pitched. In 2001, she put together a dominant season on the mound, going 24-8 with a 0.95 ERA in 191.2 innings pitched. She had 172 strikeouts that year.

She also threw 88 complete games in her career and had 32 shutouts. Opponents hit only .182 against Klyse during her career. She was a 2002 and 2003 All-North Central Conference selection as a pitcher for the Vikings and was named the NCC Pitcher of the Week five times during her career.

Klyse graduated from Augustana in 2003 with a degree in communications.
